

We invite you to explore The University of Arizona Campus and all it has to offer:


### • Explore the campus arboretum:



#### • Visit Sabino Canyon, a natural gem:



# Points of Interest

Visit museums around the city to learn more about Tucson and it's fauna and flora:

#### • Visit Presidio San Agustín del Tucson Museum:

"The Presidio San Agustín del Tucson Museum is a reconstruction of the original Tucson Presidio built in 1775....the Turquoise Trail [is] a 2.5-mile walking trail through downtown Tucson that highlights structures and sites of historic interest."



#### • Visit the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum:

"Guests will enjoy a quintessential Sonoran Desert experience which includes: an unforgettable fusion zoo, botanical garden, natural history museum, aquarium and art gallery."

#### Visit Old Tucson:
