We have had **an amazing year in our school's history** as we solidify our identity as a leader in pharmaceutical sciences and clinical pharmacy education, research, and practice.

The UC Irvine School of Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Sciences has grown to 720 total students, with 478 undergraduate students, 68 PhD students, 27 master's students, and 147 PharmD students. 



Dr. Nana Entsuah and Dr. Cheryl Wisseh co-authored a study entitled "Potentially Inappropriate Medication Use among Underserved Older Latino Adults," published in the Journal of Clinical Medicine. The study focused on medication use among Latino adults aged 65 years and older. Specifically, the authors examined the prevalence of potentially inappropriate medication (PIM) use within this vulnerable population.



Community Health Fair

Provided Health Services to Over 200 People in Santa Ana's Underrepresented Minority Communities

Dr. Nana Entsuah and Dr. Cheryl Wisseh, along with other faculty leaders from the UCI Susan & Henry Samueli College of Health Sciences Interprofessional Education & Practice (IPEP) Collaborative, coordinated the organization's first community health fair, an event that provided chronic disease screening and health education to underrepresented minority communities in and around Santa Ana.



UCI Awarded \$2.4 Million Grant

to Study Potential Treatment for Cancer-Related Cognitive Impairment





The University of California, Irvine has been awarded a five-year, \$2.4 million grant from the National Cancer Institute to evaluate the augmentation of brain-derived neurotropic factor to alleviate cancer-related cognitive impairment. This project translates findings from past human studies conducted by Dr. Alexandre Chan into the laboratory. The multiple principal investigator team study is being conducted in partnership with Dr. Munjal Acharya, associate professor of anatomy and neurobiology.

UCI School of Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Sciences Faculty Help High School Students Explore Careers in Healthcare

As part of the UCI Early Academic Outreach Program's Choosing a Major Conference, faculty from the UCI School of Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Sciences joined other Susan & Henry Samueli College of Health Sciences professionals to teach 150 Orange County high school students about careers in healthcare. The event was hosted by faculty and staff from the Health Affairs Interprofessional Education & Practice Collaborative and the Center for Educational Partnerships.

Sjogren Lab

Regulator of G protein Signaling (RGS) proteins have emerged in recent decades as novel drug targets in disease states such as hypertension, cancer, Parkinson's disease, and more. In the Sjogren Lab, research focuses on identifying the mechanisms by which RGS protein levels and activity are controlled and developing targeting strategies in drug discovery efforts.



Trader Lab

The Trader Lab team works to develop chemical strategies to control and harness protein degradation mediated by the proteasome, a multiprotein, multicatalytic site complex that acts as the main pathway for protein degradation in cells. Researchers seek to identify compounds that enable the stimulation, rescue, and direction of protein degradation.















Paegel Lab

Researchers in the Paegel Lab study and apply the principles of miniaturization to expand the pipeline of new medicines by democratizing drug discovery and investigating novel therapeutic targets that do not conform to the canonical constraints of druggability.





Benavente Lab

With an emphasis on rare childhood solid tumors, researchers in the Benavente Lab work to advance our knowledge of, and develop novel therapeutics to eradicate, cancer. The lab's research interests include retinoblastoma, osteosarcoma, small cell lung cancer, triple negative breast cancer, and epigenomics of pediatric solid tumors.





Kwon Lab

In the Kwon Lab, also known as BioTherapeutics Engineering Laboratory or BioTEL, researchers study multimodal gene carriers, engineered extracellular vesicles for comprehensive molecular therapy, and nanoantibiotics to develop more effective methods of treating disease.



Albrecht Lab

The Albrecht Lab aims to uncover the role of methylation in signal transduction, cellular metabolism, and human disease. The team of researchers study Arginine methylation and use chemical and cell biological approaches to understand fundamental cell biology, define the basis for human disease, and target the undruggable proteome with proximity-based medicine.



Martínez Lab

Microproteins are proteins composed of less than 100 amino acids encoded by small open reading frames (smORFs). The mission of the Martínez Lab is to identify, characterize, and examine the therapeutic potential of microproteins involved in disease.
