



The Randy Lewis All-University Student Leadership Conference (All-U) is named after the former Executive Associate Dean of Students Randy Lewis, who was dedicated to the leadership experiences and development of UCI students.

The "All-U," established in 1984 under Randy's leadership, engages 150 students each year during a full weekend (off-campus) of leadership building activities and training.

Program Highlights

- The premier leadership opportunity for UCI students, the All-U conference celebrated its 40th year in the fall of 2023.
- Approximately 150 emerging and established student leaders representing a diverse campus community participate each year.
- This program is the only one of its kind among the University of California campuses.
- UC Irvine's campus leaders and executives have participated in the program since its inception.
- The number of conference "alumni" exceeds 7,500 students.
- **The conference includes:**
 - Workshops on various topics, including: Racial climate, diversity and social justice; Career decision-making and preparation; Free speech; Community building; Skills building around public speaking, communication, time management, and more; Personal branding; Self-care and wellness; Student leadership practices.
