All those whose abstract has been accepted must submit a paper prior to the symposium consistent with the following guidelines.

Papers and PowerPoint presentations are to be emailed to PMSymposium@utdallas.edu by April 24, 2026.

Paper Guidelines

General

- Contents of the paper must be consistent with the abstract submitted by author on which acceptance is based.
- 2. Paper should not have been previously published (we are seeking new knowledge and information.)
- 3. Paper must not be commercial or promotional for any products or organizations. (this is an educational symposium at a public institution).
- 4. Paper should be professionally produced with high quality, with grammar and spelling carefully checked before submittal.
- 5. All previously published information, quotations, images or data used in the paper must be properly referenced; all papers will be checked for plagiarism.
- 6. Authors retain copyright.
- 7. Cite any use of Generative AI in preparing the paper, following the guidelines established by the UT Dallas Jindal School of Management: "Typically, all content that you pulled from another source must be cited. This includes for papers, presentations, reports, and scholarly writing. For generative AI, you would cite:
 - Generated text or data that you rewrote, revised, or rephrased
 - Generated text that you copy/pasted. Use quotation marks.
 - Quoted generated text that you discuss in a paper, report, or presentation
 - Al tools used to process or analyze data
 - Creative works like images, data visualizations, videos, or music"

Formatting

Language: English

File Type – MS Word (not PDF)

Font Type – Times New Roman, Ariel or Calibri font

Font Size – 14 pt for major headings; 13 pt for sub-headings, 12 pt for body of paper

Title – Top of first page, centered, 16 pt, Ariel Bold, first letter of main words capitalized.

Author Name – 2nd line, centered, just below title on first page, 12 pt.

Form – Introduction or Abstract, body of paper (with headings and sub-headings as needed), Conclusion, References.

Headings and Sub-Headings – use as many as you like; numbering is ok but not required. Headings and sub-heading should be **bold** type.

Capitalization – All CAPS are not needed; Title, heading and sub-headings should capitalize first letter of primary words (nouns, verbs, important adjectives), not syncategorematic words (prepositions, connectors, etc.) like "the", "and", "a", "or", etc.

Paragraphs and Sections – paragraphs should contain no more than 200 words (150 words per paragraph preferred); sections should generally include 3-6 paragraphs. Extra long sentences should be avoided. New paragraphs should NOT be indented. Paragraphs should be separated by a single blank line.

Footnotes – bottom of pages ok, automatically generated ok, 10 pt font size.

References – listed at end of paper, can be in 11 pt font, not automatically generated, in following format:

Author last name, initials (year published), title, name of publication, location, volume #, month or issue #, URL with live link, if possible (date accessed).

Images, Figures & Exhibits – good to include, 5 max per paper, no more than one on first page.

Acronyms – Spell out the word the first time used, with acronym in parentheses; use of the acronym can then be used freely in the text.

Margins – Top and bottom: .5"; right and left sides: 1"

Line Spacing – Single spacing, or 1.15 max; NO 1.5 or double line spacing.

Length of paper (# of pages) – Minimum 5 pages, maximum 10 pages

Header = .5" margin, blank (no text)

Footer – font size: 10 pt; .6" margin, left side: 17th UT Dallas PM Symposium, 29-30 May 2025; right side: page #

Note:

Authoring a well-written professional paper can demonstrate tacit project management knowledge and represent professional maturity. Authoring a professional paper can often enhance a career and can be cited on one's personal résumé.

All symposium papers will be posted as PDF files on the UT Dallas PM Symposium website after the symposium at https://jindal.utdallas.edu/events/project-management-symposium/

Some symposium papers will be selected for republication in the <u>PM World Journal</u>, based on topics and quality. The selected authors and papers will receive international exposure.
